



Senior services will be closed on **Tuesday, March 6**th for a staff meeting, and on **Friday, March 30**th in observance of Good Friday!



Emergency Home Response Service: (EHRS)

Call Today.... We can assess your needs and keep you at home.

EHRS is a Community Care Program core service provided to improve the independence and safety of clients in their own homes and help reduce the need for nursing home care.



Emergency Home Response Service (EHRS) is a 24-hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults with documented health and safety needs and mobility limitations. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device worn by the participant that will automatically link the older adult to a professionally trained staffed support center. For more information on Emergency Home Response Services in your community, contact Senior Services at 217-347-5569.

EHRS offers 24-hours-a-day help at the touch of a button, installation at no cost to the client, free adaptive activation devices, and a list of first responders chosen by the client. To receive this service, an older adult must qualify for the Community Care Program.



Benefit Access Program (formerly Circuit Breaker)

Parts of the Department on Aging's Benefit Access Program, formerly known as the Circuit Breaker Program, allows for the Secretary of State's office to provide for a reduced-fee license plates aimed toward senior citizens and persons with disabilities with specific qualifications.

Apply on the Benefit Access Application if you meet the following requirements:

1. Age

- You must be 65 years of age or older before January 1, 2012; or
- You must become 65 years of age during 2016 (benefits become available after you turn 65); or
- You must be 16 years of age or older before January 1, 2016 and qualify as disabled

2. Residency

You must live in Illinois at the time you file your application

3. Income Limit

Your total income in 2016 must be less than

- \$27,610 if filing an application for yourself only; or
- \$37,635 if filing an application for yourself and your spouse, or yourself and one Qualified Additional Resident; or
- \$45,657 if filing an application for yourself, your spouse* and at least one Qualified Additional Resident, or yourself and at least 2 Qualified Additional Residents.

4. Expiration

Benefits are good for 2 years under the Benefit Access Program. The 2-year period starts at the time you are approved for benefits. You may file again up to 90 days before your benefits expire.

- Colorectal cancer is cancer that occurs in the colon or rectum. It is the second leading cancer killer in the U.S.
- According to the State Cancer Profiles, Effingham County averages 24 NEW cases of colorectal cancer each year which is nearly 40% HIGHER than the national average!
- Screening for colorectal cancer saves lives and is recommended for men and women aged 50 and older.
- There are several different ways to screen for colorectal cancer Colonoscopy, FOBT screening, F.I.T. screening to name a few.
- The Effingham County Health Department and the Lakeland College Nursing Class have joined the American Cancer Society to ensure 80% of folks over age 50 get screened for colon cancer in 2018.
- Nursing students will be giving a presentation on the newest form of colorectal screening, F.I.T. screening. F.I.T. screening is easy, requires no prep, and can be done in the comfort of your home. What's more? The screening kit is highly affordable and offered by the Effingham County Health Department!

AARP Tax Assistance at Suzette Brumleve Memorial Effingham Public Library

The Effingham Public Library is pleased to partner with the AARP Tax Aide Program in providing free tax preparation and return assistance for any low to moderate income tax payers at the library on Tuesdays in February, March and April.

Those interested in using this free tax service should call the library's Reference Desk, Monday through Friday, at 217-342-2464 ext 1 to make an appointment.

AARP Tax Aide Program requires that participants bring: Photo id for the taxpayer and spouse, Social security card or some official document showing the social security number of any individual appearing on the tax return, a copy of your 2016 Tax Return, all income forms: W-2, 1099-Misc, 1099R, railroad, SSA, etc., royalties, interest and dividend statements, health insurance documents, business income and expense records, real estate taxes paid records, charitable contributions records, any other deductible expense records.


