OIG WARNING: Offers to Increase Your Social Security Benefit Are From Criminals

That unexpected offer from the Social Security Administration (SSA) to activate a benefit increase is from a criminal and not the real SSA. Do not share personal or financial information. Do not click on links or respond.

Report suspected scams to oig.ssa.gov/report.

Criminals continue to impersonate SSA and other government agencies in an attempt to obtain personal information, money, or download malware onto phones.

Recent reports indicate that criminals are trying to trick people into sharing personal and financial information over the phone or through deceptive text and email messages that lure recipients to a fake Social Security website. Criminals falsely advise recipients to apply to receive Social Security benefits or extra money, such as a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA), or to set up an online account. The message may also provide fake contact information for SSA.

HOW A GOVERNMENT IMPOSTER SCAM WORKS

Recognizing the signs of a scam can help you avoid falling victim to one. These scams primarily use telephone to contact you, but scammers may also use email, text message, social media, or U.S. mail. Scammers pretend to be from an agency or organization you know to gain your trust. Scammers say there is a **problem or a prize**. Scammers **pressure** you to act immediately. Scammers tell you to pay in a specific way.

TIPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF

- 1. Do not take immediate action. If you receive a communication that causes a strong emotional response, take a deep breath. Hang up or ignore the message. Talk to someone you trust.
- 2. Do not transfer your money! Do not buy that gift card! Never pay someone who insists that you pay with a gift card, prepaid debit card, Internet currency or cryptocurrency, wire transfer, money transfer, or by mailing cash. Scammers use these forms of payment because they are hard to trace.
- 3. Be skeptical. Do not believe scammers who "transfer" your call to a government official or law enforcement officer, or who feed you a number as proof. Scammers can create fake numbers and identities. Do not trust your caller ID.
- 4. Be cautious of any contact claiming to be from a government agency or law enforcement, telling you about a problem you don't recognize or an unsolicited offer. Do not provide your personal information, even if the caller has some of your information.
- 5. Do not click on links or attachments. Block unwanted calls and text messages.

Community Care Program

".... Helping older people live independently"

Did you know that ECCOA Senior Services is contracted with the Illinois Dept on Aging to provide the Community Care Program for 9 counties within the State of Illinois? The counties we serve are: Effingham, Clay, Fayette,

Jefferson, Marion, Jasper, Crawford, Richland, and Lawrence. All of our offices are your direct linkage to all the information you need regarding community based services that can give you many added benefits that enhance your quality of life. As you prepare to retire or if you become disabled, the staff members in our offices will assist you with the services that will allow you to remain in your own home, and keep you out of a nursing home, as long as nursing home placement is not necessary for you. We will send out staff to your home at no cost to discuss your needs and goals, and to help you choose what services might be right for you. Services include In-Home Service, Adult Day Services, Emergency Home Response Service, Home Delivered Meals, Respite Care for the Caregiver, and in some areas of the state, Senior Companion. If you qualify for services, the staff member will work with you to determine your

needs, set up services that are appropriate for you and keep in touch with you to make sure the services continue to meet your needs. For additional information or to make a referral for someone you feel could benefit from the program call 217-347-5569.

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Emergency Home Response Service: (EHRS)

EHRS is a Community Care Program core service provided to improve the independence and safety of clients in their own homes and help reduce the need for nursing home care.



Emergency Home Response Service (EHRS) is a 24-hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults with documented health and safety needs and mobility limitations. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device worn by the participant that will automatically link the older adult to a professionally trained staffed support center. For more information on Emergency Home Response Services in your community, contact Senior Services at 217-347-5569.

EHRS offers 24-hours-a-day help at the touch of a button, installation at no cost to the client, free adaptive activation devices, and a list of first responders chosen by the client. To receive this service, an older adult must qualify for the Community Care Program. This service is now available for cell phones too.

Cost is \$25 per person and includes all supplies (payment is due on the day of the class and upon arrival)



Long Term Care Ombudsman Resident.... Advocate

As an individual living in a long-term care facility, you retain the same rights as every citizen of Illinois and of the United States. The Illinois Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program strives to protect and promote the rights and quality of life for those who reside in long-term care facilities. This month, in **part 5** of our Ombudsman spotlight, we are highlighting regulations and providing clarity on specific rights granted to residents living in long-term care facilities.

Your rights to stay in your facility

- ► You have the right to keep living in your facility.
- ➤ You must be given written notice if your facility wants you to move from the facility. The reasons for asking you to leave must only be for the following reasons:
 - · you are a danger to yourself or others;
 - · your needs cannot be met by the facility;
 - your health has improved and you no longer need the services of a long-term care facility;
 - · you have not paid your bill after reasonable notice;
 - · your facility closes.
- ➤ The notice must:
 - o tell you why your facility wants you to move;
 - o tell you how to appeal the decision to the Illinois Department of public Health,
 - o provide a stamped and addressed envelope for you to mail your appeal in; and
 - o be received 30 days prior to the day they want you to move from a Medicare or Medicaid certified facility
 - be received 21 days prior to the day they want you to move from a State licensed facility.
- ► You have the right to appeal to the Illinois Department of Public Health and if you choose to appeal:
 - o a Department of Public Health Hearing officer will travel to your facility to hear why you believe you should stay in the facility and why the facility believes you should move, and
 - usually your facility cannot make you leave until the appeal is decided by the Department of Public Health.
 - o If you do not appeal the decision, you are agreeing to the transfer or discharge.
- ▶ Before your facility can transfer or discharge you, it must prepare you no be sure that your discharge is safe and appropriate.
- ➤ You cannot be forced to leave your facility because you are applying for Medicaid or you are on Medicaid and a Medicaid bed is available. It is important to ask the facility how many Medical beds it has available.
- ➤ You have the right to ask the Long-Term Care Ombudsman for help in appealing the transfer or discharge. Call 1-800-252-8966 (voice and TTY).
- ▶ If you have a developmental disability or mental illness, you may ask Equip for Equality, Inc. for help in appealing your facility's forcing you to move. Call 1-800-537-2632 (voice and TTY).
- ➤ You must be allowed to return to your facility after you are hospitalized as long as you still need that level of care. If you get Medicaid and are hospitalized for ten or fewer days, your facility must let you return when you leave the hospital even if the facility has given you a written discharge notice. If you are hospitalized for more than ten days, your facility must let you return if it has a bed available and you still need that level of care. If your facility is full, you must be allowed to have the first available bed, if you still need that level of care.
- ➤ You have the right to be told in advance and in writing if your room is being changed (Medicare or Medicaid certified facilities only)
- ▶ You have the right to choose your roommate when practicable.
- ➤ You have the right to receive notice, including the reason for the change before your room or roommate is the facility is changed.






Line Dancing
